## Tickets sites 'still mislead on price'

TICKET resale sites still show misleading prices despite a crackdown.

Watchdogs last week told Viagogo, StubHub, Seatwave and GetMeIn! to be clear about extras such as booking fees.

But our probe found full prices are still not shown until checkout.

Viagogo's £69 Kylie Minogue tickets go up to £109.99. StubHub's £115.22 for Tony Bellew v David Haye rose to £137.69.

Seatwave's £136.12 to see U2 shot up to £162.11.

And on Get Me In! the £93.50 for Britney Spears was actually £121.73.

The Advertising Standards Authority warned of sanctions. StubHub, Get Me In! and Seatwave said they were still working to comply. Viagogo did not comment.

# THE Sun ON SUNDAY SAVE OUR SHELTERS CAMPAIGN

**DEVASTATED Penny Clough this week made a heartfelt plea for ministers to get behind The Sun on Sunday's Save Our Shelters campaign during a visit to Downing Street.**

She even handed over the last Mother's Day card sent to her by daughter Jane, who was murdered by her abusive ex-partner.

But PM Theresa May refused to reverse changes that have put one third of Britain's shelters at risk.

Penny told us: "I left Downing Street feeling deflated and absolutely underwhelmed."

"I wanted to bang my head on one of the Prime Minister's beautiful walls with utter frustration at the real lack of help and support for our victim's services."

"Theresa May missed a great opportunity, as a woman who is the most powerful political person in the country, to do something iconic and incredible."

"She could have announced statutory funding for refugees - but she failed."

Penny and husband John backed it last week, when they told how 26-year-old Jane was stabbed to death by Jonathan Vass, 30, in July 2010.

He attacked her outside Blackpool Victoria Hospital where she worked while he was on bail for sexual abuse and rape.

Jane was living with her parents in Barrowford, Lancs, at the time after fleeing violent Vass. She had thanked her mum for her support in her Mother's Day card four months earlier.

Jane's card read: "I can't thank you enough for the past few months. I know without your support I would not have got this far."

### 'I beg you to do more'

"I know how difficult this has been for you too but we are going to get through this, whatever happens."

Penny, 58, handed the card to Amber Rudd on Thursday outside No10, and the Home Secretary said she would pass it on to Mrs May.

She and John, 57, were in Downing Street to attend an International Women's Day reception, and raised their concerns about Government plans to remove refugees from the welfare system.

Jane's Place, the refuge Penny and John set up in Burnley to honour their daughter, is just one that is under threat.

The reforms would mean women in hostels no longer receive housing benefit, which accounts for 53 per cent of refuge funding.

Research by Women's Aid shows that the plans would lead to 39 per cent of the 270 refuge services in England closing for good.

Another 13 per cent would be forced to reduce beds, leaving 4,000 desperate women and children unable to access a safe place.

With the Mother's Day card, Penny enclosed a letter to the PM, urging "action now, not rhetoric, I beg you to do more".

It read: "We are giving victims their lives back and enabling their recovery. What do I tell the people we turn away - do we say YOU care?"

Mrs May used the occasion to release a good-news statement about domestic violence, promising new laws that will protect victims.

But campaigners say she did not go far enough.

Women's Aid CEO Katie Ghose, who was also at the reception, said: "We are pleased the Prime Minister showed that she has listened to our concerns by recognising that there must be sustainable funding for refugees to put an end to the current postcode lottery of support services that only puts women and children's lives at further risk."

"But the Prime Minister has still not ruled out the current proposed changes to the way refugees are funded, which threaten these life-saving services with closure."

## SURVIVOR SUPPORT

OUR new consultation on domestic abuse is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to improve Britain's response to this terrible crime.

I know The Sun on Sunday's readers care deeply about domestic abuse survivors and I urge everyone, but especially those who have suffered, to take part.

It is appalling that two million people are victims of domestic abuse every year. Most are women, and while convictions are up by a third since 2010, we must do more.

We are providing new money to stop abuse occurring. Children who witness domestic abuse are far more likely to experience abuse as adults, so I am setting up an £8million fund to support their recovery.

### Last resort

Two million pounds has been dedicated to female offenders who have been victims of domestic abuse, as it is telling that more than 60 per cent say they have suffered.

Be in no doubt, we will provide more national funding for refugees.

Everyone who has housing costs paid for currently will continue to under any new model. There are ten per cent more beds now than in 2010, and I will not oversee cuts.

However, these vital refuges should be places of last resort.

Survivors also need help before they seek refuge, which is why our new plans are about intervening early and stopping abuse.

We need to stop asking: "Why doesn't she leave?" and start saying: "Why doesn't he stop?"
